Banners to St. Peter's Square and return. It starts at 1.15pm.**

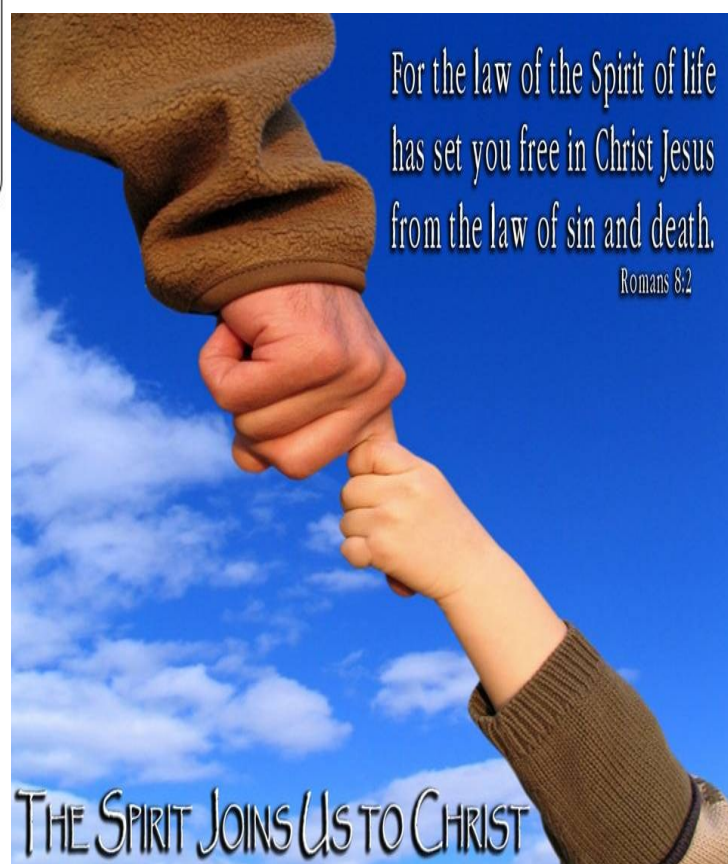
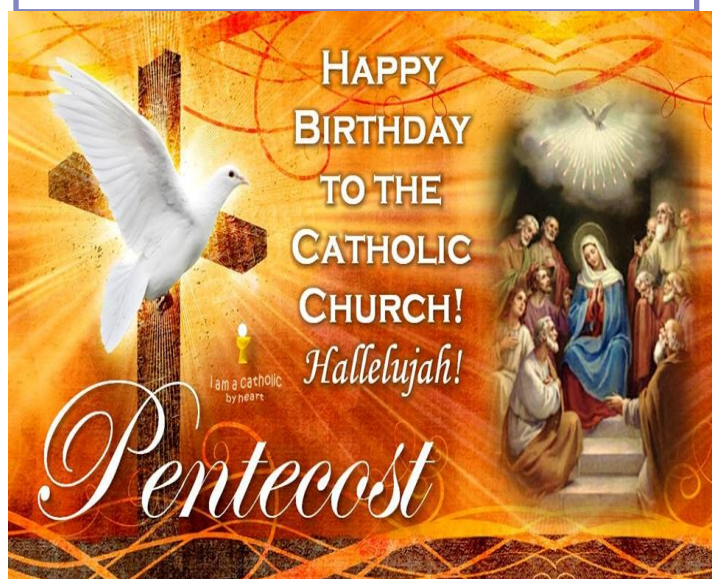
Thank you to everyone from our two churches that takes part.

**This Week's Feasts: This Week's Feasts: Mon: St Bede the
Venerable**, born in 673, was educated by the Benedictines; he
became a monk in Jarrow, and began a life of learning,
producing many writings, interpretation of the Scriptures and
the History of the British Church. He died in 735.
St. Aldhelm, born in 639, became Abbot of Malmesbury and
Bishop of Sherburne. Revered as a musician and song-writer,
he died in 709.

Tue: St. Philip Neri, known for prayerfulness and fun, born in
Florence in 1515, arrived in Rome, and after a mystical
experience in the catacombs, gathered friends to care for the
sick, which became the Oratory. He died in 1595.

Wed: St. Augustine of Canterbury was sent in 597 by Pope
Gregory to evangelise Britain. Despite turning back, he
converted king Ethelbert, founding the see of Canterbury. He
died in 605.

Thur: Bl. Lanfranc, born Italy, educated France, became a
monk, then Archbishop of Canterbury in 1070, dying in 1089.
Bl. Margaret Pole, Countess of Salisbury, born in 1487, was
governess of the young Princess Mary. Upon the King's
marriage to Anne Boleyn she spent 2 years in the Tower,
beheaded by a clumsy axe-man in 1541.

Fri: Bl. Richard Thirkeld, born in Durham, ordained at
Rheims, was arrested while visiting a prisoner in York Gaol.
Having admitted his priesthood, he was executed in 1583.

Sat: St. Luke Kirby, born in Northern England, ordained in
Rome 1579, was arrested landing at Dover and martyred in
1582 with **Bl. Thomas Cottam** from Lancashire.

**HOW WELL DO YOU KNOW OUR
PARISH STORY?**

1836 The Rev D Hearne was devoted to the welfare
of the youthful portion of his flock, and exerted
himself very much to make the children attend the
school regularly. The neighbourhood was the most
wretched part of Manchester. The District of St.
Patrick's extended many miles and contained the
poorest and most abandoned and immoral people.
Very few decent persons lived in it. Frequent and
very dreadful fights took place close to the
Convent. Children and even adults were often to be
seen shamefully naked. Horrid language was on the
people's lips. Father Hearne had great power with
them and subdued their fury in many ways,
labouring among them with great zeal and
generosity.
